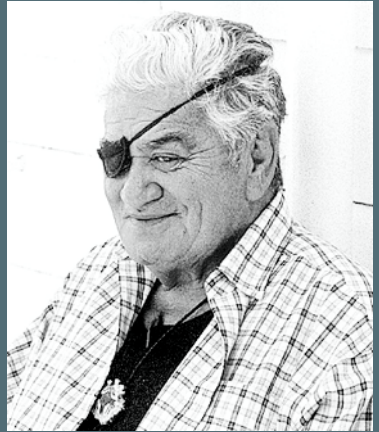
# he kupu poroporoaki

Kua takatahi koa nga kaihautu o te waka o Porourangi, i te wewenga atu o wetahi o wa raua tamariki ki tua o te arai. Hei konei tatau poroporoaki atu ai ki a ratau e tu manuhiri nei ki nga marae kei te po. E Koro, e Mate haere! haere atu koutou ki te wiwi e whanga mai na mo koutou.

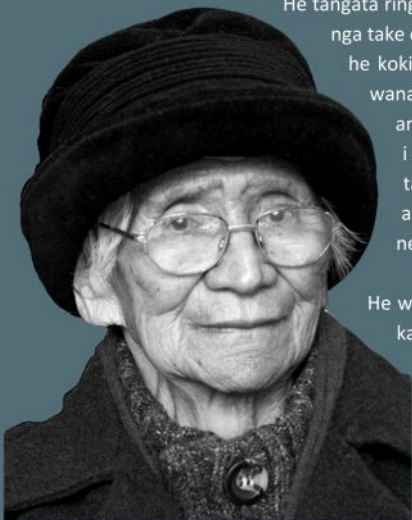
I tipu iho a Koro i roto i te ao Maori, a, na konei ka noho te karangatanga tohunga ki runga ki a ia mo nga take e pa ana ki te Reo ake me nga Tikanga ake o Ngati Porou. Heoi, no te mea i kakahuria a ia ki wenei matauranga, he mahi mama noa te huarahi ki nga kawa, ki te mita o nga reo me nga tikanga o nga iwi puta noa a Aotearoa.

I a ia i te kei o te waka mo te Reo i te te Whare Wananga o Wikitoria, i kokiritia e a ia kia tu he "Professor" mo Te Reo Maori i te Te Whare Wananga o Wikitoria. I tutuki i a ia tenei kokiri. I taua wa ano hoki, ko a ia te pakeke me te kaiarahi o te roopu e mohiotia nei ko te "Maori Language Society". Ko nga mema o te roopu nei, he akoranga katoa nana. Na tenei roopu ka tu te kaupapa ia tau, e kiia nei, ko "Te Wiki o Te Reo Maori" ( Maori Language Week).

Na Koro te "M.A. Thesis" tuatahi ki te tuhia ki roto i Te Reo Maori, a, na tenei, ka piki te mana o te reo Maori ki nga whare whare wananga Pakeha. I taea noatia hoki e Koro nga tohu "B.A.", a, "M.A." hoki i te Whare Wananga o Akarana. Ahakoa noa tenei, i riro ke na Te Whare Wananga o Wikitoria i uhi ki runga ki a ia te tohu "D.LITT," mo wana kaupapa mo nga Matauranga Maori me wana kohinga korero kei Te Whare Pukapuka o Wikitoria e putu ana.



He tangata rīnga raua mo nga take huhua o Ngati Porou, me wetahi atu o nga take o te motu, aita he aha nga kaupapa, ahakoa he take whenua, he kokiri ki Te Karauna me wana mema, he tautohe ki nga whare wananga o te ao Pakeha me te pukahu noa o nga ahuatanga e pa ara ki te ao Maori. Ko te mana o Ngati Porou tetahi o nga take i pa ki tana poho me tana whatu manawa. Kare a ia e tautoko kia riro te mana o tana iwi ki raro i te mana o tetahi atu iwi. No reira e Koro, haere, a, waiho mai matau ki muri nei kokiri ai nga tumanako i tumanakohia e koe mo te iwi.



He wahine humarie a Mate, a, kare ke ana aha ake ki te tangata, ka mutu tonu ko te mihi ki te tangata, me tana mingomingo kata paku nei hei tapiri ki ana tangitangi ki te tangata, a, hei korowai hoki mo tana ahua humarie. Ka whakakakahutia e a ia te "Reo" me nga "Tikanga" hei rapaki i a ia, a mate noa, a, na wenei whakaaro, a mahi ana, i mohio whanuitia ai a ia e nga iwi me nga roopu whakahaere i nga take e pa ana ki te Reo me nga Tikanga o te ao Maori.

Mai i tana whanautanga i kai ai a ia i te Reo, a, ka pakeke, ko a ia tonu tetahi o nga tohunga whakaako i te Reo ki nga uri whakatipu, i roto i nga kura. Kare i mutu ana mahi mo te Reo ki koneke, engari, ka whangaitia e a ia ana mohiotanga ki nga taura here, a, tae atu ki te Taura Whiri i Te Reo. I te ra nei, kua ngaro tenei o nga kairui o nga purapura o te Reo ki nga mahinga kua parautia nei, mai i nga ra kei muri tae mai ki wenei ra. Na reira e hine, haere, tukua iho ko o mahi hei tauria mo matau, me nga roopu i awhitia e koe i a koe e takatu ana ki te ao tu roa nei. Ko koe tonu i tu kei o te waka i te wa i taraitia ai te waka e kiia nei i te ra nei, ko Radio Ngati Porou. Ka hoki nga mahara ki nga ra e whaiwhai haere ai tatau i te kawana me wana Minita, mai i tetahi pito o te motu, ki tetahi pito, kia whakamanatia te Reo Irirangi o Ngati Porou.

E kore e hapa nga korero mo te wahine nei, no te mea ko wana tohungatanga e mohio whanuitia ana, a, ko te wairua o wana koroingotanga mo te Reo me te mana tuturu o tana iwi, kua whakairotia ki nga pou o te whare tipuna e kiia nei ko "Te Wiwi Nati". E te koka, Haere! Haere! Haere!

# history

The lectures were the brainchild of Emeritus Professor Tamati Reedy. In 1983, he was serving a Fullbright Scholarship teaching a two semester course on Maori - Pacific Origins and Linguistics at the University of Alabama (USA). The irony of the situation hit him. "There I was feeding students/scholars on who and what we are - enabled of course by the generosity of the US scholarship system - and our own back home were unable to participate," Professor Reedy recalled.



He wrote back home to Ngata College and introduced the idea of the Ngata Memorial Lectures, to commemorate Sir A. T. Ngata and his monumental service to Ngati Porou and the nation. "John Clark was Principal then," recalled Tamati, "Kate Walker, Mate Kaiwai and Tom Te Maro were all totally in support," he said. "The first lectures centred on C Company, where we were privileged with the attendance of Colonel Charles Bennett and our own Sir Henare Ngata, and many who've now passed on."

Api has been the chairman of Te Runanga o Ngati Porou since 1987. He has played a major leadership role in ensuring Ngati Porou receive as fair and just a settlement offer as possible in the present political environment.

His aspirations for Ngati Porou have always been around self-determination and self-reliance, which include wealth creation in terms of our social cultural and economic resources. Fundamentally though, his aspiration is for us to be good to one another and to care for one another.



**hekia parata**

Hekia is of Ngati Porou and Ngai Tahu descent. Her hapu include Ngati Horowai, Te Aitanga-a-Mate and Te Whanau-a-Rakairoa.

Hekia is the National Party's List MP for the Mana Electorate in Wellington. Hekia entered parliament in November 2008, prior to entering politics she worked in both the public and private sectors. Hekia is a graduate of Ngata Memorial College, and she has held positions in the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Trade, the Prime Minister's Advisory Group, Ministry for the Environment, Housing Corporation of New Zealand, Te Puni Kokiri and the State Services Commission.

Hekia will be speaking about the relevance of E Tipu E Rea as a prescription for the future.



**tukoroirangi morgan**  
chair of te arataura

Tukoroirangi is co-negotiator on the Waikato River claim and is the chair of Te Arataura and the Waikato Raupatu Trustee Company. He has extensive experience in parliamentary processes and the public sector, and has been instrumental in the Waikato River Settlement alongside the late Lady Raiha Mahuta. He is also a member of the Iwi Leaders Forum.

Tukoroirangi will be sharing Tainui's post-settlement experience with us. In May 1995 the Crown signed a Deed of Settlement with Waikato-Tainui that included cash and land valued at \$170 million. It was, the deed noted, an endeavour between the Crown and the claimants to settle the Waikato claim and to remove the sense of grievance felt by Waikato that went back to the 1860s.

Barry is of Te Aitanga-a-Mate, Te Aowera, Te Whanau a Rakairoa, Ngati Horowai and Te Whanau a Ruataupare ki Tuparoa descent.

Barry is the executive officer and trustee of the Taurahere in Auckland. He has an extensive business background, a former joint owner of Critchlow Ltd - a digital mapping company, and a director of Aotearoa Credit Union. Barry co-leads the Ngati Porou kapa-haka team, Porou Ariki, who qualified for Te Matatini 2011.

Barry will be describing the 'Nati' community in Auckland and the Taurahere's ten year strategy for engagement. He will develop the concept of "Ngati Porou People Power" – capturing and leveraging the skills of Auckland based Nati's. for the benefit of the tribe.

ceo ngati whatua

Tiwana is of Ngati Porou and Te Whanau a Apanui descent. His hapu include Te Whanau a Karuwai, Te Whanau a Rakairoa and Ngati Rangī.

Tiwana has been the CEO of Ngati Whatua ki Orakei Maori Trust Board in Auckland since 1998. From 1990-1997 he was the Chief Financial Officer of MDC (Maori Economic Development). He is also a member of the NZ Institute of Directors and NZ Institute of Chartered Accountants.

He also co-edited the book "He Whanau no Maraehara" and is Chair of Ngati Porou ki Tamaki Taura Here.

Tiwana will speak about his practical experience with regards to managing and growing Treaty assets for a tribal group. And deploying the benefits to the people and revitalising the culture.

Tina is of Te Whanau a Rakairoa, Te Aitanga-a-Mate and Ngati Horowai descent.

Tina is the CEO of Ngati Porou Whanui Forest Ltd. She has worked in forestry, property management, commercial entities and post settlement structures. Tina is currently helping to build a strategy for Matauranga and other research, science and technology to assist Ngati Porou to use these tools to advance our collective marae, hapu and where appropriate, iwi aspirations.

Tina will be talking about this strategy and how we can turn the korero into reality and be engaged in areas that align with our natural strengths. Several examples of how other Iwi have used these tools to advance their people will also be discussed.

ceo radio ngati porou

Erana is of Ngati Porou, Rongowhakaata and Te Aitanga-a-Mahaki descent. Her hapu include Te Aitanga a Mate, Te Aowera, Te Whanau a Takimoana, Te Whanau a Iritekura.

Erana is the CEO of Radio Ngati Porou, and has an extensive background in the media industry covering print, radio and television.

Her career began in the mid-1980s as a cadet for Te Karere, and has reported for and produced news, current affairs and documentaries. Erana was the founding editor of Nati Link and produced Te Reo Maori programmes for Radio Ngati Porou.

Erana will be talking about what motivated her to organise the first Huinga Rangatahi in 1985, and why it became the catalyst for her career in the media industry.



**kahurangi waititi**  
elite sportswoman

Kahurangi is of Ngati Porou, Te Whanau-a-Apanui and Ngai Tahu descent. Her hapu include Te Whanau a Takimoana, Kauaetangohia and Kati Huirapa.

Kahurangi is a member of the Waikato/BOP Magic Netball Team, who came runners-up in the Trans-Tasman ANZ Championships. She has played for a variety of netball teams including New Zealand under 21's and the New Zealand A team.

In 2007 Kahurangi completed a Masters of Arts, majoring in Screen and Media Studies and is also interested in the processes and frameworks for iwi to archive their stories and histories.

Kahurangi will talk about her experiences as a young Maori woman in elite sport and some of the challenges Maori face in this arena.



**trisha hina**  
elite sportswoman

Trish belongs to Te Whanau-a-Hunaara, Te Whanua-a-Takimoana and Te Whanua-a-Uruahi. She is a member of the current Black Ferns' team that was all-conquering at the Women's Rugby World Cup last month. The Auckland based mid-fielder has a host of sporting accomplishments to her name including the rare feat of representing New Zealand in three sporting codes: rugby, softball and rugby league.

She has been part of the victorious Kiwi Ferns in three Rugby League World Cup tournaments. She was justifiably named Player of the Tournament at the 2000 and 2003 World Cups.

Trish has worked very hard throughout her life to be where she is today. She will be sharing her experiences with a view to inspiring other young Ngati Porou to chase their dreams.

## te haeata

Te Haeata is a 10-member subcommittee responsible for the supervision of the Ngati Porou Treaty of Waitangi Settlement Negotiations with the Crown. Seven were appointed by their hapu clusters and three negotiators were appointed by the Runanga. The role of the hapu representatives has been to facilitate a two-way conversation between Ngati Porou whanau and hapu and the negotiating team who have been striving to get the best settlement package for us all.

## petroleum & mineral exploration permits

This session allows the sharing of information on the proposed oil drilling programme in the Raukumara Basin and its implications for hapu. We will also discuss the Governments actions in light of our Treaty protected rights and our indigenous rights. A road map for collective action will also be presented by Dayle Takitimu and Rikirangi Gage who have been leading the charge on this for Te Whanau-a-Apanui.

## foreshore seabed committee

In April 2009 a committee was appointed to work with hapu so that hapu can implement the Nga Hapu o Ngati Porou Foreshore & Seabed Deed of Agreement and ready themselves to use the instruments in the Deed. A major part of their role is to help hapu become fully informed of their mana, rights and responsibilities under the Deed. The committee, chaired by Rei Kohere, will update whanau on the repealing of the FSSB Act by the crown, the benefits of the new law for hapu and what is going to happen to the current Deed of Agreement.
